OVERVIEW FLYER

Archbishop Paul D. Etienne invites everyone to celebrate the Year of the Eucharist, which started June 2020 and will continue to June 2021. In his Pastoral Letter, *“The Work of Redemption: Eucharistic Belief and Practice in the Archdiocese of Seattle,”* he encourages us to grow our understanding and experience of the Eucharist.

Many parishes and Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of Seattle are bringing the Year of the Eucharist to life by providing opportunities to go deeper including Adoration, resource materials, webinars, small group study and more. Throughout the Year of the Eucharist, we’ll explore four themes, reflecting the order of the Mass:

- **Gathering (June–Sept.)** – We focus on the return to public Mass, to gather as communities once again in the midst of COVID-19.
- **Word (Oct.–Dec.)** – The Church never celebrates the liturgy without proclaiming the Word of God. During this period, we focus on the power of God’s Word, how it is proclaimed in the liturgy, and how we bring it to life every day.
- **Presence (Jan.–March)** – We focus on the Real Presence of Christ in the liturgy, especially in the sacrament of his Body and Blood.
- **Sending (April–June)** – We focus on the commissioning at the end of Mass, when we are sent forth to love and to serve.

What is the Year of the Eucharist?

The Year of the Eucharist is a special observance in the Archdiocese of Seattle. It is a time to focus on the Eucharist, the center of our sacramental life. It began on June 14, 2020, and continues until June 6, 2021.

Why a year of the Eucharist?

In his pastoral letter, *The Work of Redemption: Eucharistic Belief and Practice in the Archdiocese of Seattle*, Archbishop Paul D. Etienne wrote:

“Our goal is for all Catholics to enter into the mystery we celebrate in order to appreciate it more fully, and we hope that the faithful may also recognize the implications of the sending rite at the end of Mass as a commissioning to live this Eucharistic life in the world, to carry out the mission of Jesus in our day-to-day life.”

What should parishes be doing to observe the Year of the Eucharist?

In his pastoral letter, Archbishop Etienne identifies two main ways for parishes to observe the Year of the Eucharist: “the primary focus of this Year of the Eucharist is to increase our understanding and elevate the quality of how we celebrate the Eucharist at Mass.”

- **This first way** is a time to provide some special opportunities for people of every age group and level of catechesis to learn about the Mass and the mystery of the Eucharist.
- **The second way** is for parishes to carefully evaluate their own liturgical celebrations to make improvements as necessary.

Along with his pastoral letter, Archbishop Etienne released new Archdiocesan policies on Eucharist to be implemented by November 29, 2020, the First Sunday of Advent. Link to the new policies [here](#). Link to a webinar overview of the Eucharist policies here. ([need link for webinar](#))

What are the themes for the Year of the Eucharist?

While parishes are free to celebrate this year as they see fit, we are proposing four themes, provide a way of reflecting on the breadth of the Eucharist during this year. The four themes reflect the pattern of the Mass:

- **June-August: Gathering.**
We focus on the return to public Mass, to gathering as communities once again in the midst of COVID-19.
- **September-December: Word.**
The Church never celebrates the liturgy without proclaiming the Word of God. During this period, we focus on the power of God’s Word, how it is proclaimed in the liturgy, and how it comes to life in our everyday lives.
- **January-March: Presence.**
We focus on the Real Presence of Christ in the liturgy, especially in the sacrament of his Body and Blood.
- **April-June: Sending.**
We focus on the commissioning at the end of Mass, when we are sent forth to love and to serve.

What resources are available from the Archdiocese for the Year of the Eucharist?

In addition to the Archbishop’s pastoral letter, parishes have a full toolkit of resources to use throughout the Year of the Eucharist. This kit includes:



A PASTORAL LETTER FROM ARCHBISHOP ETIENNE



The Work of Redemption

Eucharistic Belief and Practice in the Archdiocese of Seattle

INTRODUCTION

In my first year in the Archdiocese of Seattle, I have been able to celebrate Mass in dozens of our parishes and missions. Everywhere I have been, I have encountered vibrant, faith-filled communities of believers. Whether large or small, urban or rural, our parishes devote much care and attention to their liturgical celebrations. The reason for this is quite simple: "The Church draws her life from the Eucharist." The Eucharist is central to our life as Church and as individual Christian believers. In a very real way, we cannot live without it.

The COVID-19 pandemic has impacted every aspect of our lives, including our worship. For us Catholics, the pandemic, along with the "Eucharistic fast" it imposed, has revealed in a new way how central the celebration of the Eucharist is to who we are as Church and as community. Even when we are unable to gather physically, we gather spiritually: Parishes continue to put the celebration of the Eucharist at the forefront of parish life through livestreams on social media. But we have also come to realize, perhaps as never before, that there is no substitute for gathering to celebrate the Eucharist *together*, and receiving the sacrament of Christ's Body and Blood as part of a community of believers.

As I come to the end of my first year in Seattle, I invite all of us in this local Church to a renewed

focus on the heart of our faith and the center of our parish life: the Eucharist. The Eucharist is an inexhaustible source of grace, the Paschal Mystery of Christ's dying and rising daily renewed for our salvation and for the salvation of the whole world. The Eucharist is the living presence of Christ in our midst. That presence does not, must not leave us unchanged: Receiving the Body of Christ, we become the Body of Christ. The Eucharist unites us to Christ, and, in Christ, to each other. And the Eucharist commits us to the poor, sending us forth in service and love.

When it comes to the Eucharist, we can always go deeper. No matter whether we have spent years exploring Eucharistic theology, or are still preparing for our first Holy Communion, there is always more to discover about the Eucharist. And no matter the resources of our parish communities, with care and attention our liturgies can always be improved, to reflect more clearly the Christ who truly presides at every celebration of the Eucharist. During the coming year, I ask every Catholic and every parish community to commit themselves to deepening our understanding and experience of the Eucharist, and strengthening our Eucharistic liturgies.

In a spirit of encouragement, and with a desire for a more profound and visible unity around the altar of the Lord, I am sharing this pastoral letter on

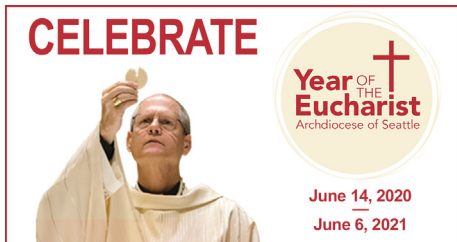

- For an increase in vocations to the priesthood, that many generous-hearted young men may respond to the call to serve God's people, proclaiming Christ's word and celebrating his Eucharist. We pray to the Lord.
- For young people, that they may come to know and to love the Eucharist, in which Christ comes to us and the very work of our redemption is accomplished. We pray to the Lord.
- For all of us, that the Eucharist we celebrate and receive this day may renew us in faith, hope, and love. We pray to the Lord.

WORD theme (to use Oct-Dec 2020)

- For the Church, that we may read the signs of the times in the light of the Gospel. We pray to the Lord.
- For all who do not know Christ, that they may discover the power of his life-giving Word. We pray to the Lord.
- For young people, that they may come to know and love the Bible, and turn to God's powerful Word in all the decisions of their lives. We pray to the Lord.
- For all of us, that the Word of God may take root in our hearts and yield a harvest that is a hundredfold. We pray to the Lord.
- For all Christians, that we may let the Word of God shape our priorities and influence our actions. We pray to the Lord.

SENDING theme (to use Apr-June 2021)

- For the Church, that the Eucharist we celebrate may unite us and impel us to deeper love and more generous service. We pray to the Lord.
- For the world, that all who do not know Christ may encounter him through the loving, authentic witness of those who believe. We pray to the Lord.
- For the poor, the sick, the lonely; for those deprived of justice; for all who live on the margins of society; that they may find in us good and generous friends. We pray to the Lord.
- For young people who are considering their vocation in life, that they may be open to the possibility that God is calling them to ministry and service in the Church. We pray to the Lord.
- For all of us, that we may live the Eucharist we celebrate, and truly become the Body of Christ in the world. We pray to the Lord.

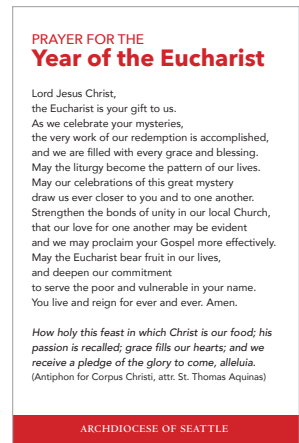
Prayer for the Year of the Eucharist

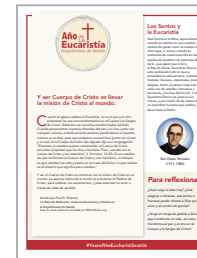
