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<p>Essential Concepts</p> <p>TRINITY: God the Creator; Jesus the Redeemer; and Holy Spirit as Sanctifier [249-324, 683-701, 727-730]</p>	<p>Seventh Grade: New Testament</p> <p>Articulate that the central mystery of the Christian faith is the Most Holy Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.</p> <p>Name and define characteristics of God: loving, good, truth, beautiful, eternal, omniscient, omnipotent, and omnipresent.</p> <p>Begin to recognize we can know characteristics of God, but our understanding of God will always be limited as our human minds and words can never fully understand the mystery of God.</p> <p>Locate and cite passages in the New Testament that include all three Person(s) of the Holy Trinity, e.g., Baptism of Christ, sending of the Paraclete.</p>
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<p>Essential Concepts</p> <p>THE CREED: A Statement of Our Belief [185-1065]</p>	<p>Seventh Grade: New Testament</p> <p>Profess the Nicene and Apostles Creed and identify New Testament verses contained within them.</p> <p>Recall the definition of Creed, as a summary statement of beliefs that we profess as our Christian faith.</p> <p>Recognize the “resurrection of the dead” as essential to Christianity: We have risen with Christ in Baptism and participate in the life of the Risen Christ.</p>
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TASK OF CATECHESIS 2 – LITURGICAL EDUCATION: *Students recognize the presence of Christ and enter into communion with Him through active, full, and conscious participation in the Liturgical celebrations and Sacraments of the Church.*

Describe how the **Sacraments at the Service of Communion** offer recipients the grace to grow in holiness through their gift of self.

Describe how **priests** act in the person of Christ.

Describe how married couples model the love of Christ through their sacrificial love for each other (**unitive**) and their openness for the blessings of children (**procreative**).

TASK OF CATECHESIS 6 – MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP AND SERVICE: *Students acquire and demonstrate skills to recognize their gifts from God and their vocation to share the Good News of Jesus Christ in word and deed in the world.*

BAPTISMAL CALL AND DISCIPLESHIP (the mandate to go forth) [816, 849]	Identify people in the New Testament who answered God's call to <u>discipleship</u> . Discuss how Jesus is the way and the truth and the life (Jn 14:6). Identify in Scripture, recite, and understand the implications of the great commission given us by Jesus "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations..."(Mt 28:16-20).

Essential Concepts	Seventh Grade: New Testament
CALL TO STEWARDSHIP AND SERVICE: Catholic Social Teaching about the common good [1905-1948, 2419-2422]	Recognize how stewardship is important to both our spiritual life and the spiritual life of the Parish. Name talents and gifts from God that holy people in the New Testament used to serve God's people, and identify ways to serve God using the principles of the <u>common good</u> and <u>preferential option for the poor</u> .

CALL TO ECUMENISM, INTERRELIGIOUS DIALOGUE, AND THE NEW EVANGELIZATION [848-860, 927-933, 905, 2044,2472]	Recognize the importance of the <u>New Evangelization</u> . Understand the need to respect the religious faith of others, while also sharing our beliefs with them in word and action. Know <u>Islam</u> is a religion that shares the Jewish and Christian belief in one God (<u>monotheism</u>). Identify how we are called to know God and proclaim the <u>Good News of Jesus Christ</u> through the way we both live and act.
