Protecting God's Children

No particular educational background is needed to be a *Protecting God's Children* Facilitator. Successful facilitators may include clergy, religious, employees, or volunteers who share a commitment to protecting children. Teachers, counselors, case workers, or health care professionals also make great trainers.

A successful Safe Environment Facilitator is”

- Comfortable speaking and presenting to an audience
- Level headed in stressful situations
- Emotionally and psychologically stable
- Compassionate towards others
- Reasonably objective about sexual abuse
- Comfortable discussing sexual issues
- Able to maintain confidentiality
- Motivated to participate in the program
- Compliant with Safe Environment Program requirements
- Willing to attend training updates

All facilitators must obtain an endorsement and a signed application from the appointed pastoral leader (Pastor, Priest Administrator, Pastoral Coordinator, or Principal). The application may NOT be signed by the PAA or SEP Coordinator. Clergy who wish to become trainers must obtain approval from Archbishop Peter Sartain.

Approved trainers will participate in *Protecting God's Children: Train the Facilitator*. This is a one-day certification that will prepare them to lead the *Protecting God's Children* class. Participants must complete the entire training to be valid.

The cost of the training is paid for by the Archdiocese of Seattle. All training materials, as well as lunch and parking, will be provided free of charge.

Cancellations must be made within 24 hours of the training or the participant's parish or school will be charged a \$25.00 cancellation fee.
