Prayer: Scriptural Rosary for Refugees and Migrants

Overview

- The USCCB's <u>Justice for Immigrants</u> has put together reflections on the Mysteries of the Rosary that help us to see the life of refugees and migrants in the life of Christ.
 - "Praying the Rosary is one way in which we can respond to the four calls of Welcoming the Stranger. As we reflect on the events in the lives of Jesus and Mary, we are invited to consider how even today, we, as Christ's Mystical Body, continue to share these joyful, luminous, sorrowful, and glorious experiences with one another." Environment

- It is suggested that the 'How to Pray the Rosary' page and the page with the chosen mysteries be given to each person in case someone is uncomfortable praying the rosary, and for the visual learners so they can read along as the mystery is read aloud.
- This could be prayed in the style of a living rosary. This would involve a bit more set up, where the students represent the beads.
 - A beautiful visual involves every bead having a corresponding candle/tea light. As the group prays together, a lighter is passed for people to light the candle(s) they are standing/sitting near.
