MONSTRANCE FOR VOCATIONS Parish FAQ Sheet

At the Chrism Mass on Thursday, March 21, 2013, the Most Reverend J. Peter Sartain, Archbishop of Seattle, blessed the Monstrance for Vocations. The Monstrance spent the next six years traveling throughout the Archdiocese visiting every parish and mission to facilitate prayer for vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

- April October 2013 Southern Deanery
- October 2013 December 2014 South Sound Deanery
 - January November 2015 Pierce Deanery
 - December 2015 August 2016 Olympic Deanery
 - October 2016 May 2018 South King Deanery
 - June 2018 October 2018 South Seattle Deanery

 - March June 2019 Eastside Deanery
 - Snohomish Deanery (July October 2019)
 - Northern Deanery (November 2019 February 2020)

After a pause during the pandemic, the monstrance is now ready to travel again!

1. When will my parish have the Monstrance?

Contact Kathleen Koeneman in the Vocations office to make sure the monstrance is available. Work with your pastor (and dean if it will be traveling in your deanery) to organize a schedule that will work for all of you. We recommend each parish to have the monstrance for 1 week and for each mission to have it for 1 week.

2. What do we do while the Monstrance is in our parish?

At minimum, while the monstrance is there in your parish and/or mission, spend at least one Holy Hour praying for vocations in your church. Of course, you are encouraged to have as many parishioners attend as possible and perhaps those who might be discerning a vocation to priesthood or religious life. You are welcome and encouraged to do more than this if you already have regular adoration or if you would like to organize a procession/other events as well!

3. What resources are included with the Monstrance?
