College-Aged Young Adults - servant leadership formation, summer of faith-filled work, leading & serving all aspects of program

Highlights

- Summer 2024: Over 300 youth & adult participants from 22 Catholic parishes & schools
- Summer 2024: Served an average of 650 families weekly at Agape Food Bank
- Over 30 hours of direct service & 11 hours of formation/ prayer led by Agape staff for groups in 5-day experience
- Aug. 2024: 530 backpacks full of school supplies distributed
- Always strive to provide culturally-relevant items served in a bilingual (Spanish-English) setting



- Approx. 1.5-2 million men, women, & children who plant, pick, & pack our fruits & veggies; work our dairies, nurseries, & feedlots
- 71% are Foreign-born workers; at least 50% are working without legal documentation
- Age of 12: one can be legally hired to work
- For every \$1 you spend on produce, a farmworker only gets 9 cents
- Agriculture is one of the most hazardous occupations in the U.S.
- Skilled laborers whose work is dignified & essential
- Our neighbors who have touched our food, and therefore our lives nfwm.org

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SERVICE, COMMUNITY + PRAYER

Groups have the opportunity to encounter siblings in Christ through service, community, & prayer.

The week (Sun. afternoon-Thurs. morning) includes: **Prayer + Formation** - Daily sessions of prayer, social justice formation, & reflection root our work in Christ and Catholic Social Teaching; Mass & Adoration

Community Building - Engaging activities help strengthen your group & community through the culture of encounter

Agape Food Bank - Groups spend a day & a half setting up and running a food bank for the farmworker community in Whatcom County

Mobile Food Distribution - Working to eliminate barriers to food (ex: transportation), groups bring food directly to farmworker housing sites

Summer Enrichment for Children of Farmworkers - Create community with children at local farmworker housing sites; provide educational & recreational activities (ex: sports, games, crafts, reading)

Volunteer Farm Work - Support local mission-oriented farms; helping farms that are caring for creation & people

Donations

- Groups are asked to collect donations for Agape Food Bank in their communities prior to their week
- You will be assigned specific donations to be collected (ex: hygiene items, clothing, etc.)

Community Living

We intentionally live simply to enter into a spirit of solidarity. Group Leaders need to ensure their groups are ready to enter into a simplistic, community-centric week.

- We recognize that the communities we serve may not receive the quantity and quality of food that we may be accustomed to, therefore we serve simpler meals to bring us closer to our family in Christ.
- The groups share in the responsibility of daily chores.
- Groups will stay at Assumption Catholic School & Parish, sleeping in classrooms. Groups will sleep in separate rooms according to gender, and will sleep on the floor.
- Showers at a site in the community will be provided 2 times during the week.



PARTICIPATION Group Size

The maximum number of **youth participants per week is 40**; if a parish/school group is smaller, you will have the opportunity to combine with another group of middle or high school youth.

Expected Adult Participation


The group's adults play a necessary and important role in the Agape week. Their involvement and positive leadership sets the example and creates a rewarding experience for the youth and the community we serve.

- **Preparation** It is imperative that the group leader prepares their chaperones to be ready for this experience and ensures that the adults know what it means to be a chaperone.
- **Transportation** Adults are responsible for their group's transportation to and from Agape, as well as throughout the week. (Agape staff cannot transport participants.)

Group Leader vs. Adult Chaperone/Leader

• **Group Leader** - Every group is required to have a group leader (ex: youth minister, teacher, parish volunteer) who will serve as the main contact with the Agape Staff. We are ready to support you with engaging and practical resources as you prepare and form the youth and adult leaders.







You get to focus on your youth and their spiritual growth because we take care of the logistics and programming.

Staff - Agape has 7+ passionate, faith-filled, and experienced program staff who work together to coordinate and plan the entire program. This includes: planning for the summer, facilitating morning and evening sessions of prayer and reflection, leading community building, cooking and general cleaning, shopping for supplies, and leading service projects.

5+ of the staff are college-aged young adults (typically including 1 seminarian) who are on fire for their faith and excited to work with youth - this offers a unique opportunity for youth to witness the faith lives of college students. Summer 2025



Program Fees

- \$500 non-refundable group reservation fee due with group online reservation to secure your week
- \$450 per youth participant (in addition to the reservation fee)
- Adults are FREE!

The program fee funds: lodging, all meals, t-shirts, programming (formation, reflections, prayer, etc.), service supplies, resources, operations & safety supplies, and the staff who make it possible.

REGISTRATION & PAYMENT SCHEDULE

- \$500 **non-refundable** group reservation fee is due after the online group reservation to secure your week (your parish/school will be invoiced)
- Due by March 1: Finalized number of youth participants
- Due by May 1: \$450 per youth participant (your parish/school will be invoiced)
- Due two weeks before your group's arrival: Participant list and information Registration Policies:
- Your group is considered registered once BOTH your online reservation <u>and</u> reservation fee have been received. Week dates are filled first come, first served.
 - Upon reservation, your group will maintain a soft hold of your first (or second) preferred week and will be invoiced for the \$500 through the Archdiocese. Please notify your bookkeeper to be aware of this fee.
 - The Agape Director will confirm your soft hold dates before initiating the invoice
- At the time of reservation, you will be asked to enter a realistic <u>estimated</u> number of youth participants (this helps us determine if we will host 2+ groups in one week).
- Your <u>finalized</u> number of youth participants is due by March 1, which sets the total invoice balance due on May 1.
 - Once your finalized group number is submitted, your parish/school will be invoiced for the total participant fee (\$450 per youth) through the Archdiocese.
 - If it turns out you are unable to get enough youth participants to sign up after you have submitted your final number, please note you will still be responsible for the total balance. Financial responsibility for unused spots can only be released if Agape is able to find another group to cover your remaining spots.
