PURPOSE

This research guide provides an overview of Native American-related materials in the Archives of the Archdiocese of Seattle. It aims to streamline the research process by consolidating information about relevant records scattered throughout various collections.

The guide describes all known materials relating to Native communities in our archives, offering a starting point for researchers exploring Indigenous experiences within the context of Pacific Northwest Catholic history. Archives staff are available to collaborate with researchers in navigating these collections and uncovering historical records.

SCOPE

This research guide focuses on records of Native peoples and related missionary priests, religious orders, and events within the Archdiocese of Seattle, west of the Cascade Mountains. When the Diocese of Yakima and the Diocese of Spokane were formed from the territory of the original Diocese of Seattle, records of missions, parishes, and tribes in those areas were transferred to their respective diocesan collections.

Religious Orders such as the Oblates of Mary Immaculate, Jesuits, and Sisters of Providence maintain independent archives, as they operate separately from the Archdiocese of Seattle. Contact information for these dioceses and religious orders is available in the "Further Contact Information" section.

Records in this guide span the entire history of the Archdiocese of Seattle from the 1830s to the present. While we aimed for completeness, some records related to Native Americans may not yet have been identified. If other records are discovered, Archives Staff will update this guide, with version numbers and dates listed in the Document History section.

STATEMENT ON POTENTIALLY HARMFUL MATERIALS

Researchers accessing records referenced in this guide may encounter outdated terms, expressions of harmful worldviews, or inaccurate representations that do not reflect the current values of the Archdiocese of Seattle or the Archives staff. The Archives is committed to properly contextualizing these materials and revising archival descriptions with culturally sensitive and accurate language. In some cases, original titles used by creators have been preserved to provide historical context for the collections. 1. TRACING FAMILY HISTORIES AND GENEALOGIES

ABOUT: This section describes records in the collection with detailed personal and family information, including sacramental registers and school enrollment records. Researchers can uncover names, tribal affiliations, family connections, and cultural data, making these materials useful for exploring ancestral ties and community networks.

Early Missionary Sacramental Records (1830s-1930s)

Description: A collection of 19th and early 20th century registers of recorded sacraments provided to Native communities, primarily in the Salish Sea (Puget Sound) region. Most entries were recorded in French by Oblates of Mary Immaculate (OMI) missionaries. All sacramental records have been translated and transcribed into a searchable spreadsheet format.

How organized: Organized chronologically by date of sacrament within bound register books.

Relevance and Potential Uses: This collection is a significant genealogical and historical resource for Native researchers. It documents baptisms, confirmations, marriages, and deaths – giving names (including original Native names in early volumes), dates, locations, parental information, and tribal affiliations. Early records sometimes provide geographic details about where certain tribes or bands were located during specific times of the year, such as winter camps, in the period before reservations were established.

Topics Covered: Native missionization, sacramental records, genealogical information.

Types of Records Included: baptismal, first communion, confirmation, marriage, and death or burial records.

Early Vancouver Mission Sacramental Records (1838-1890)

Description: Records of sacraments provided to Native communities, primarily in Southwest and South-Central Washington. Vancouver, Washington, the original headquarters of the Diocese of Nesqually, served as the central location for these records.

How organized: Organized chronologically by date of sacrament in bound register books.

Relevance and Potential Uses: Dating back to the 1830s, these registers are the Archdiocese's oldest sacramental records, documenting the first missionary efforts among Indigenous peoples in South Central and Southwestern Washington. They include the same genealogical information as mentioned in the previous section, including original Native names in early volumes.

- **Tribes Documented** in Volumes 1 and 2: Cathlamet, Cowlitz, "People of the Lake," Walla Walla, Cayuse, Klickitat, S'Klallam/Clallam, Chinook, Nisqually, Snohomish, Colville, Okanogan, and Spokane.
- **Other Groups with Fewer Entries:** Cowichan, Flathead, Nez Perce, Sook, Cree, Iroquois, Pend d'Oreille, and Kanaka (Native Hawaiian).
- **Volumes 3 and 4** focus more on Euro-American sacramental records, with fewer Native entries.
- **Research Note:** The first two volumes have been translated from French to English and published as *Catholic Church Records of the Pacific Northwest: Vancouver Volume 1 & 2 and Stellamaris Mission* by French Prairie Press. These translations are available at the [Seattle Public Library, online at the Internet Archive](#), and in our reading room.

Parish Sacramental Registers (1870s-1936)

Description: Registers documenting sacraments performed in established parishes and missions within the Archdiocese of Seattle, recorded at fixed locations rather than by traveling priests and temporary missions of the *Early Missionary Sacramental Records*. They include some sacraments for Native American Catholics recorded alongside other Catholics. While "Indian" is occasionally noted, this was done inconsistently, and after 1900, ethnicity or tribal affiliation is rarely recorded. The registers contain the same detailed genealogical information as the Early Missionary Sacramental Records.

How Organized: This section of the guide is organized by tribe or people. Under each tribe, records of parishes that served those communities are listed. Entries within the registers were recorded chronologically by date of sacrament.

Relevance and Potential Uses: As with the other sacramental records previously mentioned, these registers may be an important genealogical resource, documenting Native Catholic individuals' life events, family connections, and occasional tribal affiliations.

Topics Covered: Native missionization, sacramental records, genealogical information.

Types of Records Included: Baptism, first communion, confirmation, marriage, and death records.

Boarding School Records (1888-1948)

Description: Administrative records from St. George Indian School, one of three Catholic Indian boarding schools in Western Washington. Our Lady of Seven Dolours School in Tulalip was operated by the Sisters of Providence, and St. Anne Mission School was operated by the Oblates of Mary Immaculate, then the Sisters of Providence, and later the federal government. As they were not run by the Archdiocese of Seattle, those records are not part of our collection. Our efforts to locate Tulalip Catholic boarding school records through the Providence Archives, the Royal B.C. Archives (which holds the Oblates' records), and federal records at the National Archives have been unsuccessful and are still ongoing.

How organized: Records are grouped by type—Accounts, Correspondence, History, and Enrollment records—and arranged chronologically within each type.

Relevance and Potential Uses: These records provide a rich resource for genealogical, historical, and tribal membership research, offering some insights into the operations of the school and the identities of individual students, including:

- **Student Details:** First and last name, date of enrollment, school year
- **Family Information:** Parent or guardian's first and last name, tribal affiliation

- **Cultural Data:** Percentage of Native ancestry (for later students)
- **Sacramental Details:** Sacraments received (in some cases)
- **Location:** Sometimes residence city and state where students' families lived
- **Remarks:** Notes on family incidents, including illnesses, homesickness, runaways, deaths, or removals by family members.

Primary Groups Represented:

- Tulalip, Puyallup, Nisqually, Muckleshoot, Lummi, Yakama, Chehalis, Suquamish, Cowlitz, Quinault, Squaxin Island, Skokomish, Snoqualmie, Sauk-Suiattle, Colville, Makah, Klallam or S'Klallam, Quileute, Swinomish, Skagit, Willapa, Duwamish.
- Tlingit, Tsimshian, and Haida, and other tribes and/or villages from Alaska and British Columbia.

Limitations: There are no student “transcripts” that record grades, classes, or subjects taken. However, correspondence folders may include discussions of individual students and family situations.

Topics Covered: Education, genealogical information, missionization, boarding schools, tribal/Church relations, cultural interactions.

Types of Records Included: Correspondence, reports, enrollment records, and meeting minutes.

2. UNDERSTANDING COMMUNITY HISTORIES & CHURCH RELATIONS

ABOUT: This section contains parish/mission and priest files documenting the historical relationship between the Catholic Church and Native communities. These records provide context on missionary activities, community histories, and the clergy's interactions with Native communities.

Parish and Mission Files (1860s-1960s)

Description: A collection of files related to parishes and missions, compiled before the 1970s. The files included here in this guide are for parishes and missions that were near or served Native American populations in some manner.

Arrangement: Alphabetical order, by city, then by parish or mission name.

Relevance and Potential Uses: Parish and mission files provide important background for research on tribal communities within the Archdiocese. The records can shed light on the cultural and religious interactions between Native communities and the Catholic Church, documenting the Church's engagement with Indigenous populations and reservation life. They preserve stories and perspectives often absent from other historical sources, offering a unique view on the Church's perception of Native communities and the priorities it placed on their needs.

Topics Covered: Native missionization, tribal/Church relations, land issues, cultural interactions, parish life.

Types of Records Included: Newspaper clippings, correspondence, memorabilia.

Native American Subject Files (1860s-1970s)

Diocesan Priest Files (1847-1983)

Description: Contains the biographical and correspondence files of priests under the authority of the Archdiocese of Seattle (formerly the Diocese of Nesqually). It does not include priests from religious orders, such as the Oblates of Mary Immaculate, who were supervised by their own superiors (for those, see [Religious Orders](#) in the next section). The priests listed below are highlighted because they were closely involved with Native missions and schools during the late 19th and early 20th centuries.

- **Rev. Charles DeDecker:** The first Superintendent of St. George Indian School near Federal Way, Washington.
- **Rev. J. Govaert:** Succeeded Rev. DeDecker as Superintendent of St. George Indian School.
- **Rev. J. B. A. Brouillet:** Vicar General of the Diocese, instrumental in founding St. Ann Mission on the Umatilla and serving as Indian Agent to the Tulalip Reservation. He also co-founded the Bureau of Catholic Indian Missions and played a key role after the Whitman Massacre.
- **Rev. J. B. Boulet:** Associated with missions north of Seattle, including St. Joachim on the Lummi Reservation and St. Anne on the Tulalip Reservation, focusing on Snohomish, Skagit, and Whatcom Counties.
- **Rev. F. X. Prefontaine:** Assigned to Steilacoom, he ministered to Native peoples throughout the Salish Sea (Puget Sound) region. He later founded Our Lady of Good Help in Seattle, playing a pivotal role in establishing early Catholicism in the city.

How Organized: Files are arranged alphabetically by last name of priest name and then by type of record.

Relevance and Potential Uses: These files provide context on the work and perspectives of diocesan priests who ministered to Native communities, including those who served as superintendents of St. George Indian School and the boarding schools in Tulalip. Notably, Rev. J. B. Boulet's files include *Good Tidings*, a newsletter documenting missionary efforts north of Seattle at the turn of the 19th century. Additionally, Rev. J.B.A. Brouillet's files provide background on the Whitman Massacre, complementing related materials in the [Native American Subject files](#).

Topics Covered: Native missionization, education, priests, tribal/Church relations, land issues, cultural interactions.

Types of Records Included: Biographical materials, correspondence, clippings, reports, and publications.

Religious Order Priest Files (1849-1880)

Description: These records highlight the work of *religious priests*—ordained members of religious orders unattached to a specific diocese. In 19th-century Washington State, the Oblates of Mary Immaculate (OMI) and the Society of Jesus (Jesuits, SJ) were the primary missionary orders. The Oblates were especially active in Western Washington Territory during this period. Key religious order priests during this time included the following:

- **Rev. Pascal Ricard, OMI:** Superior of the Oblates (1848–1857), based at St. Joseph of Newmarket mission at Priest Point near Olympia and modern Tumwater.
- **Rev. E. C. Chirouse, OMI:** Founded St. Anne Mission among the Cayuse/Umatilla and later St. Ann Mission and School at Tulalip; served as an Indian Agent during the 1870s.
- **Rev. L. J. D’Herbomez, OMI:** Succeeded Ricard as superior in 1857, active across Washington, and later became the Vicar Apostolic of British Columbia.

- **Rev. P. Durieu, OMI:** Ministered to the Yakamas in the 1850s and became the first Bishop of New Westminster.
- **Rev. C. Pandosy, OMI:** Established missions for the Yakamas, including St. Joseph on Ahtanum Creek and Immaculate Conception Mission on the Mnassatas River.
- **Rev. Pierre Richard, OMI:** Built St. Rose of Lima Mission in Walla Walla, distinct from Rev. Pascal Ricard, OMI.
- **Rev. J. M. Cataldo, SJ:** Worked among the Nez Perces and Yakamas after the Oblates left for Canada in 1878; later became Superior of the Jesuits' Rocky Mountain Missions.
- **Rev. J. Giorda, SJ:** Active in Eastern Washington, Montana, and Idaho during the 1860s–1870s.

How Organized: Organized alphabetically by name of religious order, then by last name of priest. There are more general correspondence files included in this section as well.

Relevance and Potential Uses: Offers valuable insights into early Catholic missionary work with Native communities in Washington Territory, especially through the correspondence of Oblate priests like Ricard, Pandosy, and Chirouse. It documents key events such as the Catholic response to the Yakima War (1855–1858) and describes the strategies and challenges of missionary efforts. Much of the material is written in French and highlights linguistic and cultural interactions, including the use of Chinook Jargon.

Topics Covered: Native missionization, education, religious orders, tribal/Church relations, cultural interactions.

Types of Records Included: Personnel documents, clippings, correspondence, and legal documents.

Women Religious Records (1852-1973)

Description: Provides some documentation of the role of orders of women religious (nuns) in Native American education. Includes records of the Sisters of Providence, who served at Our Lady of Seven Dolours School in Tulalip and St. Anne School after it transitioned away from Oblate administration, as well as at St. Joseph Academy in Yakima and Vancouver Academy, both of which had some Indigenous students. The Sisters of St. Francis of Philadelphia are also included for their role as faculty and staff at St. George Indian School. The correspondence, primarily between the superiors of these orders and leaders of the Diocese of Seattle, gives a view into the administration, challenges, and relationships that shaped their work.

Relevance and Potential Uses: This collection is a resource for understanding Native education, and cultural interactions with the Catholic Church. Of particular interest is a list of orphans from the Sisters of Providence that includes some Native children. While day-to-day administrative records are kept in the orders' own archives (see Further Contact Information at the end of this guide), the included correspondence and financial reports reveal the broader operations and priorities of these religious orders.

How Organized: Arranged alphabetically by name of religious order and then chronologically within each record type.

Topics Covered: Native missionization, education, tribal-Church relations, religious orders, and cultural interactions.

Types of Records: Correspondence and financial reports, primarily between the orders' superiors and diocesan leaders.

Early Bishops' Letter Books (1846-1901)

Description: Ledgers of handwritten correspondence of the early Bishops of Nesqually, primarily Bishop A.M.A. Blanchet, with additional letters from Bishop Aegidius Junger and Bishop Edward J. O'Dea. Most are written in French and cover a wide range of diocesan activities, including the planning and administration of Native missionary efforts throughout the state. Volume 3 includes letters related to the Whitman Massacre, while Volumes 7 and 12 provide statistics on Native missions from the 1850s–1870s. Volume 12 also discusses Our Lady of Seven Dolours school at Tulalip and plans for a potential school on the Makah Reservation.

How Organized: Letters are recorded chronologically within bound books.

Relevance and Potential Uses: While most letters relate to general administration of the diocese and not specifically to Native Americans, they provide context for understanding missionary efforts throughout the state. Tribes and peoples referenced in each volume are noted in the following inventory for easy access. Of particular interest, Volume 3 includes letters regarding the Whitman Massacre, while Volumes 7 and 12 contain statistics on Native American missions from the 1850s–1870s. Volume 12 also features correspondence about Our Lady of Seven Dolours school for girls at Tulalip and plans for a potential school on the Makah Reservation. Volume 8 contains information about Bishop Blanchet's travels in Mexico and is not included in this guide. Volume 9 and 11 contain liturgical instructions and are also not included here.

Photographs (1865-1998)

Description: Photographic prints of Native peoples and the parishes and missions that served them. Offers a visual record of Native missionization, education, and events.

How Organized: Arranged by record group (RG) number, city, and parish/mission, the photographs are described at the folder level rather than individually. All pertinent identification numbers (or ranges) are included in the first column. Perhaps the most comprehensive collection is a group of photographs that formed part of a 1968 article on the Swinomish tribe for the *Catholic Northwest Progress*.

Relevance and Potential Uses: Provides researchers with visual documentation of interactions between Native communities and the Catholic Church. Photographs of late 19th- and early 20th-century ceremonies, particularly at the Lummi and Swinomish Reservations, depict how religious practices were observed. Images from a 1968 *Catholic Northwest Progress* article on the Swinomish Reservation offer additional context on the Church's mid-20th-century engagement with Native communities.

Topics Covered: Native missionization, photographs, education, tribal/Church relations, land issues, cultural interactions, events.

Newspaper Clippings (1900-2013)

Description: *The Catholic Northwest Progress* was the official newspaper of the Archdiocese of Seattle from 1900 to 2013, and at times the official newspaper of the dioceses of Yakima and Spokane in Washington State, as well as the (then) Diocese of Alaska.

Arrangement: Organized by year and date.

Relevance and Potential Uses: This weekly publication captured the news of the diocese, including news and feature articles about Native American missions such as the those at Swinomish, Tulalip, Lummi, Muckleshoot, and St. George Indian School. The complete run of newspapers has been digitized by the Washington State Library, are fully keyword searchable, and can be found at washingtondigitalnewspapers.org. 3. RECENT CHURCH ENGAGEMENT WITH NATIVE COMMUNITIES (1960S-PRESENT)

ABOUT: This section highlights records documenting the Church's modern interactions with Native communities. Covering topics such as education, advocacy, and cultural collaboration, these materials provide insights into the evolving relationship between the Archdiocese and Native peoples in the late 20th and early 21st centuries.

Bishops' Files (1969-2010)

Description: Collection consists of subject files related to Native American issues, extracted from the larger filing systems of Seattle's Archbishops. These records span from Archbishop Hunthausen in the 1970s to the present Archbishop and Auxiliary Bishops, focusing specifically on Native American topics and initiatives.

Multicultural Ministries Records (1985-2000)

Description: Records documenting the work of the Archdiocese of Seattle’s Multicultural Ministries Office and its later iterations, which supported various cultural Catholic communities, including Native Americans. Each group had a dedicated representative, with Ray Williams serving as the Native American representative throughout much of the 1980s and 1990s. The collection includes a series specifically focused on Native American Catholicism, covering the late 1980s through the 2000s.

How Organized: Divided into seven file groupings: administration, correspondence, clippings, grants, vision statements, Tekakwitha Conference, World Trade Organization 1999, and subject files related to Native American communities. Note: The Multicultural Ministries collection is not fully processed; however, working box numbers are included for reference.

Relevance and Potential Uses: This collection is valuable for studying how the Archdiocese engaged with Native communities in Western Washington during the late 20th century, shaping current programs and initiatives. It provides insight into the Church’s efforts to address social, economic, and spiritual issues impacting Indigenous communities and highlights collaborations that influenced ongoing ministry and advocacy work.

Topics Covered: Native missionization, education, tribal/Church relations, land issues, laws and legislation, grants, and cultural interactions.

Types of Records Included: Correspondence, clippings, subject files, reports, and grant and meeting materials.

Justice and Peace Initiatives (1976-1995)

Description: Records documenting the work of the Office of Catholic Charities (precursor to Catholic Community Services of Western Washington) and the Justice and Peace Office (precursor to the now-defunct Missions Office). It reflects the Archdiocese of Seattle's modern programs since the 1970s, similar to the Multicultural Ministries collection.

How Organized: Organized by name of office and then by record type.

Relevance and Potential Uses: Although these offices did not focus exclusively on Native American issues, the collection includes records from the Native American Task Force, formed in the late 1970s. These records address legislation and fishing rights and describe the Archdiocese's involvement in various social and legal issues affecting Native communities during this period.

Topics Covered: Education, tribal/Church relations, land issues, laws and legislation, cultural interactions.

Types of Records Included: Correspondence, meeting minutes, newsletters, and surveys.

4. RESEARCHING LAND AND PROPERTY HISTORIES

ABOUT: Records in this section document Church land ownership, mission claims, and cemeteries connected to Native communities. They provide insight into how lands were acquired, used, and managed, including burial practices and property transitions involving Native peoples.

Mission and Claim Records (1852-1967)

Description: Contains property records from early Native American mission land claims in 19th-century Washington Territory. Mission land claims were legal filings made by the Catholic Church to secure ownership and usage rights for lands where missions were established and sometimes include testimony from missionary priests about the land's history and purpose. Also contains later records related to St. George Indian School and Gethsemane Cemetery, now located on the school's property. Some mission records, like those of St. Joseph Mission to the Yakamas, highlight efforts to serve Native populations and may reference nearby tribes or peoples.

How Organized: Organized by type of record and then by location.

Relevance and Potential Uses: Mission claim records offer insights for researchers examining how the Catholic Church acquired and used lands that had originally belonged to Native peoples. Although often indirectly related to Native communities, the records include information about tribes or peoples near the missions, such as the Yakamas served by St. Joseph Mission.

Topics Covered: Education, missions, tribal/Church relations, land issues, cemeteries, cultural interactions.

Types of Records Included: Correspondence, maps, titles, agreements, and reports.

Cemetery Records (1902-1976)

Description: Files related to St. George Indian School Cemetery, the mission cemetery of St. Peter, Suquamish, and an unnamed “Indian” cemetery in Cashmere.

How Organized: Organized by name of cemetery and then by type of record.

Relevance and Potential Uses: The St. George Indian School cemetery file is particularly significant for Native researchers, as it includes burial lists with the names of those interred and a count of burials. The records indicate that the cemetery was of mixed use, serving both Native and white Catholics of all ages, not exclusively school students. Correspondence about the transfer of burials documents the Church’s efforts to identify the interred, contact their families, and arrange for relocation after the school’s closure. These records provide context on the cemetery’s demographics, usage, and cultural and historical importance. The Gethsemane file documents a protest occupation of a building at the site of the former St. George Indian School by activists from the Indian Group Home Coalition in 1974 and the subsequent negotiations that resulted in the Archdiocese deeding the St. George School cemetery property to the Puyallup Tribe.

Topics Covered: Education, tribal/Church relations, land issues, cemeteries, cultural interactions.

Types of Records Included: Correspondence, financial records, burial lists, and maps.
