Dear Fathers, Deacons and Parish Leaders,

I pray you are all well. Our Partners in the Gospel journey continues as parishes begin to tackle the first steps in the One Parish Planning process. To date more than 40 parish families have set up the Parish Family Advisory Council (PFAC), of which more than half have held their first meetings. This is a crucial step in providing the consultative structure to help guide the process. If you have not formed your PFAC yet, I encourage you to do that soon.

We have several important updates for you below:

Mission and Evangelization

Re-envisioning parish life so that we may all be more effective partners in sharing the Gospel is the goal of Partners in the Gospel. To help everyone understand the purpose of this strategic pastoral planning effort - and how to begin to think about new mission creativity - the Mission and Evangelization pillar group developed an in-depth Handbook chapter on it, which you can find here. This will be beneficial for all your ministries to read to foster missionary zeal and encouragement for evangelization efforts.

One Parish Planning

We are preparing a toolkit for a public launch of the One Parish Planning process at the end of March. This will include a video, talking points, a PowerPoint presentation, bulletin inserts, images and more.

Meanwhile, all the public-facing documents related to the first two listening sessions in the "Who Are We?" phase of the One Parish Planning process are now available in English, Spanish, Vietnamese, Korean and Polish (available 2/24). Standalone Parish Guidance

While there are portions of the One Parish Planning process that do not pertain to standalone parishes which are operated by non-diocesan priests, several sections, such as developing a vision and creatively thinking about mission and evangelization, are relevant.
