Summary:	RG 660 contains primarily published material about the Archdiocese of Seattle (and its predecessors), Northwest Catholicism, Native Americans, and Northwest history.

Biographical/Administrative History

Unlike other records groups in the Archives of the Archdiocese of Seattle, RG 660 Historical Publications and Reference Materials does not reflect the operations of a specific Chancery office, program, function, or even a concerted centralized collection effort. RG 660 is a collection which has been accumulated over the years to document the history of the Diocese, northwest Catholicism, and northwest history in general. Most records in this record group have not been created explicitly by the Archdiocese of Seattle or its predecessors (Diocese of Walla Walla, Diocese of Nesqually, or Diocese of Seattle). Instead, most records constitute reference material collected by priests, diocesan archivists, the Oblates of Mary Immaculate (OMI), or Chancery staff interested in diocesan history. The most prominent of these many creators and collectors was Rev. Delannoy. Rev. Joseph Mary Louis Delannoy (1867-1940) was born in Rumbeke, Belgium and ordained to the priesthood at Louvain, Belgium in 1890. Over his career, he served the Diocese of Nesqually in various positions, most prominently as Assistant at St. James Cathedral in Vancouver, WA. He also served as chaplain of St. Joseph Hospital in Bellingham, WA from 1925 until his death in 1940. Most of his notes in this record group (Series 6) date from his time at St. Joseph Hospital, Bellingham. There, he transcribed/translated early letters from founding bishops and clergy and provided copious explanatory notes for many important historical records and issues in the diocese. He also answered questions about diocesan history from internal and external requesters. Many records are his notes and commentary on issues relating to the founding of the Diocese of Nesqually and Northwest Catholic history in general.

Important dates related to this record group are:

1838 Appointment of Rev. F. N. Blanchet as Vicar General to establish a mission in Oregon. Rev. F. N. Blanchet and Rev. Modeste Demers arrived at Fort Vancouver.

1843 Pope Gregory XVI created the apostolic vicariate out of the territory between California (to the south), the Rocky Mountains (to the east), the Pacific Ocean (to the west) and Alaska (to the north) with F. N. Blanchet as its bishop.

1846 Pope Pius IX elevated Bishop F. N. Blanchet's status to Archbishop; Rev. Modeste Demers was appointed as bishop to the Diocese of Vancouver Island and Rev. A. M. A. Blanchet was appointed as bishop to the Diocese of Walla Walla.

Scope and Content

Much of this record group consists of previously published material (such as newspaper clippings, pamphlets, and reports) intended for reference and study. Also, most copies of Dissertations, Theses, and Term Papers listed in <u>Series 3</u> can be found in the catalog of their respective university libraries, but were brought together because of their relation to diocesan history.

Series 1: Anniversaries & Celebrations; Series 4: Maps; Series 5: Native American Subject Files; Series 8: Photographs; and Series 10: Statistics represent the main extent of the original manuscript material (unpublished records) in this collection created by the diocese or its priests or missionaries. These are most pertinent to the history of the Diocese.

The pamphlets series (Series 7) offers a glimpse into the reference material used by the Diocese. Perhaps the most interesting of these is the Native American Dictionaries and Language Materials subseries (Subseries 2) as these pamphlets were integral in the missionary activities among Native Peoples in Washington State.

Some prominent topics documented in this record group include: Catholic missionaries in Washington state or territory (especially Jesuits), Native Americans issues (such as education and evangelization), Native American languages (in the form of pamphlets/dictionaries), the Whitman Massacre (1847), early diocesan statistics, and the Diocesan Centennial (1950).

Detailed Description of Record Group

Series 1: Anniversaries & Celebrations, circa 1923 - 1988

<u>Scope and Content</u>: This series is a result of the celebrations in which the Chancery has participated such as the Diamond Jubilee (1925), the Catholic Sesquicentennial (1988), and the Diocese Centennial (1950-1951). Most records in this series are promotional material such as programs and booklets. There are a few folders recording the planning of these events.

Series 2: Clippings, 1848-1974

Scope and Content: This series contains both loose newspaper clippings compiled during the first half of the twentieth century as well as clipping volumes from primarily from the second half of the nineteenth century. The subject files subseries containing loose clippings relate more to the history of the Diocese and Catholicism in the Northwest. The volumes, however, which contain clippings from newspapers around the world, provide a snapshot of pertinent issues of the times, as understood by its creator. Of particular interest in this series are pages detailing the payments and donations to missions 1838-1849. These capitulations are contained in Volume VI.

Subseries 2: Clippings Volumes, 1848-1952

Scope and Content: The clippings in this subseries were organized and arranged into volumes either by Very Rev. J. B. A. Brouillet or Bishop A.M.A. Blanchet before the see was moved from Vancouver to Seattle. The 17 volumes contain almost exclusively newspaper clippings, and more specifically clippings related to Catholicism worldwide. Volume numbering reflects original numbers given by Blanchet or Brouillet. The clippings come from predominantly the *Catholic Sentinel* (Portland, OR), more than likely due to Vancouver's proximity to Portland. Other newspapers include: *New York Freeman's Journal, Oregon Churchman* (Portland, OR), *Catholic News, Catholic Mirror, Daily Oregonian, Sunday Mercury* (Portland, OR), *Le Monde* (Paris, France), *Evening Telegram* (Portland, OR), *Monitor* (San Francisco, CA), *Irish World*, the *Pilot* (Boston, MA), *New York Herald, Weekly Statesman* (possibly Walla Walla, WA), *London Tablet, Montreal True Witness, Le Nouveau Monde*, and others. In addition to general news stories, the contents of the clippings include: pastoral letters, obituaries, letters to the editor, addresses, circulars, sermons, and encyclicals.

Of particular interest in this series is the beginning of Volume VI. Before the section where newspaper clippings begin, there is "Recapitulations Depuis L'etablissement de la Mission" from the years 1838-1849. Here donations and payments were recorded which relate to early missions (Cowlitz, Vancouver, etc.). The author is unknown but is likely to be either Very Rev. J. B. A. Brouillet (the Vicar General at the time), Bishop A.M.A. Blanchet or perhaps Rev. Modeste Demers. Also of interest are articles relating to the Pacific Northwest. See <u>Appendix A</u> for an index of topics and headlines.

The remaining scrapbook relates to the City of Seattle. There is also a fragment of a scrapbook containing photographs of Bishop Aegidius Jünger (as a priest) and Rev. Louis Schram.

Series 3: Dissertations, Theses, and Term Papers, 1932-2009

Scope and Content: This collection of term papers, theses, and dissertations was primarily the result of a conscious collecting effort in the 1930s to the 1950s and the current alphabetical arrangement reflects the original. This collection focuses exclusively on the early history of the diocese and its bishops, parishes, religious orders, and institutions. The term papers were written for Seattle University's history program and in particular, history classes taught by Rev. Vincent Conway, S.J., Librarian from 1952 to 1964. Also included in this collection is a manuscript copy of the unpublished "History of the Catholic Church in the State of Washington" by Rev. William J. Metz, S.J. and a conference paper given by A. Felix Verwilghen, C.I.C.M. Another manuscript copy is Wilfred P. Schoenberg, S.J.'s *From Log Cabins to Cathedrals*.

Series 4: Maps, circa 1850s

<u>Scope and Content</u>: The hand sketched map of the Diocese of Nesqually was found inside March 1851 edition of "Rapport sur Les Missions du Diocese de Quebec." It lists placenames as: Nisqually, Cowlitz Mission, Olympia, New York [Alki Point in West Seattle], Steilacoom, and Astoria. The undated Handmade Puget Sound map mainly records topological features such as mountains, bays, straights, and rivers.

Most of the pamphlets in this subseries were written to refute the claims that Catholic missionaries (or more specifically the Very Rev. J. B. A. Brouillet) somehow instigated the massacre of Dr. Marcus Whitman and his family.
